# Continued Claims Increase by 10.3% Over the Year




Figure 1: Total Number of Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims for Wyoming Each March, 2007 to 2025




Figure 2: Total Number of Unemployment Insurance Continued Weeks Claimed for Wyoming Each March, 2007 to 2025

Initial Unemployment Insurance (UI) claims (see Definitions, page 9) remained stable over the year in March 2025. Continued claims were up 10.3% from March 2024, due to increases in industries such as construction and natural resources & mining. During each March since 2022, the number of initial (see Figure 1) and continued claims (see Figure 2, page 4) have remained relatively low compared to pre-pandemic years.

#### **Initial Claims**

Initial claims remained essentially unchanged over the year at 1,434 in March 2025, down just one claim compared to March 2024. Over the month, initial claims dropped by 265 (15.6%).

#### **UI Claims Online**




Figure 3: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, March 2024 and March 2025

The industries with the largest numbers of initial claims included construction (313); leisure & hospitality (298); trade, transportation, & utilities (257); and professional & business services (127; see Table 1, page 5, and Figure 3, page 6). Construction had the largest over-the year decrease in initial claims (-52, or -14.2%), while the greatest increase was in leisure & hospitality (42, or 16.4%).

Laramie County had the most initial claims with 192, followed by Natrona (189),




Figure 4: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence, March 2024 and March 2025

Campbell (102), and Sweetwater (93; see Figure 4, page 6, and Table 3, page 9). In addition, there were 298 out-of-state claimants. Big Horn County saw the largest over-the-year increase in initial claims with 19 (82.6%), while Natrona County had the greatest decrease (-23, or -10.8%).

#### **Continued Claims**

The total number of continued weeks claimed increased from 11,649 in March 2024 to 12,849 in March 2025 (1,200, or 10.3%). Over the year, the total number of unique claimants increased from 3,948 to 4,349 (401, or 10.2%).

The industries with the most continued weeks claimed included construction (4,112); trade, transportation, & utilities (1,713); professional & business services




Figure 5: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, March 2024 and March 2025

(1,682); and leisure & hospitality (1,379; see Table 2, page 7). Most industries saw overthe-year increases in continued claims, led by construction (291, or 7.6%) and natural resources & mining (233, or 30.9%; see Figure 5, page 8).




Figure 6: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence in Wyoming, March 2024 and March 2025

Laramie County had the greatest number of continued claims with 1,779, followed by Natrona (1,715), Campbell (1,123), and Fremont (896) counties (see Figure 6, page 8, and Table 4, page 9). There were 2,163 out-of-state continued weeks claimed.

Campbell County saw the greatest overthe-year increase in continued weeks claimed with 417, or 59.1%. Campbell County has seen over-the-year increases in claims for several months, which is consistent with recent increases in continued claims in natural resources & mining.

#### **Box: Definitions**

**Initial Claim:** An initial claim is filed by an unemployed individual after a separation from an employer. The claim requests a determination of basic eligibility for the Unemployment Insurance benefits.

Continued Weeks Claimed: The number of weeks of UI benefits claimed during the reference period. An unemployed individual who has already filed an initial claim and who has experienced a week of unemployment and then filed a continued claim to claim benefits for that week of unemployment.
