# **Continued Claims Increase 9.5% Over the Year**




Figure 1: Total Number of Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims for Wyoming Each May, 2007 to 2025




Figure 2: Total Number of Unemployment Insurance Continued Weeks Claimed for Wyoming Each May, 2007 to 2025

The number of initial and continued Unemployment Insurance (UI) claims in Wyoming (see Definitions, page 9) have gradually increased over the last three years, but still remain relatively low compared to pre-pandemic levels (see Figure 1 below and Figure 2, page 4).

#### **Initial Claims**

There were 1,190 initial claims in May 2025, up 35 (or 3.0%) from May 2024. Initial claims dropped substantially over the month (-427, or -26.4%) as warmer weather brought more seasonal job opportunities.

The industries with the largest numbers




Figure 3: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, May 2024 and May 2025

of initial claims included construction (280); trade, transportation, & utilities (179); leisure & hospitality (159); and education & health services (154; see Table 1, page 5, and Figure 3, page 6). Professional & business services had the largest over-the-year decrease in claims (-29, or -21.0%), while education & health services had the largest over-the-year increase (58, or 60.4%).

Natrona County had the greatest




Figure 4: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence, May 2024 and May 2025

number of initial claims with 190, followed by Laramie (168), Sweetwater (109), and Campbell (93) counties (see Figure 4, page 6, and Table 3, page 9). In addition, there were 189 out-of-state claimants.

#### **Continued Claims**

The total number of continued weeks claimed increased from 8,077 in May 2024 to 8,847 in May 2025 (770, or 9.5%). Over the month, continued claims decreased by 1,700 claims (-16.1%), again reflecting regular seasonal trends. The total number of unique claimants increased over the year from 2,578 to 3,195 (617, or 23.9%).




Figure 5: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, May 2024 and May 2025

The industries with the most continued weeks claimed included leisure & hospitality (1,691); construction (1,641);

trade, transportation, & utilities (1,462); and professional & business services (971; see Table 2, page 7, and Figure 5, page 8). Several industries saw substantial overthe-year increases in continued claims, including manufacturing (199, or 64.2%); trade, transportation, & utilities (175, or 13.6%), and construction (141, or 9.4%).




Figure 6: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence in Wyoming, May 2024 and May 2025

Laramie County had the largest number of continued weeks claimed with 1,184, followed by Natrona (1,126), Teton (900), and Sweetwater (661) counties (see Figure 6, page 8, and Table 4, page 9). There were 1,448 out-of-state continued claimants, up 147 (13.9%) over the year. Counties that showed unusually large over-the-year increases in continued weeks claimed included Sweetwater (167, or 33.8%), Uinta (151, or 85.8%), and Weston (44, or 163.0%).

## **Box: Definitions**

**Initial Claim:** An initial claim is filed by an unemployed individual after a separation from an employer. The claim requests a determination of basic eligibility for the Unemployment Insurance benefits.

**Continued Weeks Claimed:** The number of weeks of UI benefits claimed during the reference period. An unemployed individual who has already filed an initial claim and who has experienced a week of unemployment and then filed a continued claim to claim benefits for that week of unemployment.
