Wyoming Unemployment Insurance Claims Report, February 2021

Initial and Continued Claims Down from January




Figure 1: Total Number of Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims for Wyoming by Year and Month, January 2011 to February 2021

In memployment Insurance (UI) claims in Wyoming decreased from January to February, as initial claims fell by 17.8% and the number of total continued weeks claimed dropped by 7.8%. Initial claims often peak in December and January and then decrease in February. See Figure 1 and Figure 2, page 4.

Initial Claims

Wyoming had 4,883 initial claims (see Definitions, page 9) in February, down from 5,940 in January (-1,057 claims, or -17.8%). The number of claims declined in most industries over the month, led by construction (-259, or -17.8%) and leisure & hospitality (-184, or -25.6%). Initial claims decreased for federal (-117, or -58.5%), state (-10, or -20.0%), and




Figure 3: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, January and February 2021

local (-34, or -18.8%) government. The greatest over-the-month increase in initial claims was seen in manufacturing (53, or 30.5%). See Table 1 (page 5) and Figure 3 (page 6).

Initial claims declined in nearly all counties over the month, with the greatest decreases seen in Laramie (-146, or -18.7%), Natrona (-136, or -14.0%), and Teton (-105, or -43.2%) counties. The only over-the-month increases were seen in Big




Figure 4: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence, January and February 2021

Horn (17, or 19.8%) and Sheridan (13, or 5.9%) counties. The number of out-of-state claimants decreased by 193, or 23.1%. See Figure 4 (page 6) and Table 3 (page 9).


Continued Claims

The total number of continued weeks claimed decreased from 35,032 in January to 32,305 in February (-2,727, or -7.8%). The total number of unique claimants declined from 11,450 to 9,727 (-1,723, or -15.0%). See Figure 2 and Table 2, page 7.

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


Figure 5: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry in Wyoming, January and February 2021

Continued claims decreased in nearly all industries, with the greatest declines seen in mining (-1,503, or -39.1%), wholesale trade (-468, or -39.2%), and leisure & hospitality (-455, or -12.5%). Over-the-month increases were seen in federal government (88, or 9.5%),

information (10, or 7.1%), and state government (three, or 1.1%). Continued claims in the industry considered "unclassified" increased by 1,483 weeks, or 34.8%. See Table 2, page 7, and Figure 5, page 8.

As previously mentioned, mining showed the greatest over-the-month decrease in continued weeks claimed. In addition, total continued weeks claimed decreased in several counties that have a high concentration of mining jobs, including Natrona (-1,238, or -17.5%), Campbell (-474, or -16.2%), Sweetwater (-338, or -12.3%), and Converse (-184, or -18.8%) counties. Several counties showed an increase in continued weeks claimed, including Big Horn (115, or 25.7%), Albany (110, or 12.2%), and Sheridan (87, or 7.7%) counties. 


Figure 6: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence in Wyoming, January and February 2021

Box: Definitions

Initial Claim: An initial claim is filed by an unemployed individual after a separation from an employer. The claim requests a determination of basic eligibility for the Unemployment Insurance benefits.

Continued Weeks Claimed: The number of weeks of UI benefits claimed during the reference period. An unemployed individual who has already filed an initial claim and who has experienced a week of unemployment and then filed a continued claim to claim benefits for that week of unemployment.
