## Initial Claims Increase by 39.1% Over the Year

Tyoming had 2,193 initial Unemployment Insurance (UI) claims in Wyoming in February 2020, an over-the-year increase of 616 claims (39.1%). Wyoming has experienced an over-the-year increase in initial claims during eight of the last nine months.

#### **Initial Claims**

Most industries showed an over-the-year increase in initial claims. The greatest increases were seen in construction (275, or 48.1%), unclassified (130, or 111.1%), and natural resources & mining (83, or 75.5%). February marked the 10th straight month of over-the-year increases in initial claims in both construction and natural resources & mining. See Table 1 (page 4) and Figure 2 (page 5).

At the county level, initial claims increased over the year in 19 of the state's 23 counties. The greatest increases were seen in out-of-state claimants (135 claims, or 71.0%), followed by Laramie (119, or 57.6%), Sweetwater (84, or 87.6%), and Natrona (81, or 32.1%) counties.

The greatest over-the-year percentage increases were seen in Converse (152.6%) and Sublette (122.7%) counties. *See Figure 3 (page 5)*.

#### **Continued Claims**

Total continued weeks claimed increased by 2,864 weeks, or 18.1%. Total unique claimants increased by 861 (18.6%), while the number of claimants who exhausted their benefits increased by 79 (16.1%). See Table 2 (page 6).

The greatest over-the-year increases occurred in the unclassified industry (1,202 weeks, or 107.2%), followed by natural resources & mining (983, or 119.7%), and construction (921, or 17.1%). The greatest over-the-year decrease was seen in leisure & hospitality (-198, or 13.3%). See Figure 4 (page 7).

At the county level, the greatest increases were seen in out-of-state claimants, followed by Sweetwater (575 weeks, or 51.5%) and Natrona (445, or 21.1%) counties. *See Figure 5 (page 7) and Table 3 (page 8).* 




Figure 1: Total Number of Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims for Wyoming by Year and Month, January 2010 to February 2020

Figure 2: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by Major Industry, February 2020





Figure 3: Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence, February 2020





Figure 5: Continued Unemployment Insurance Claims by County of Residence, February 2020
