

Over-the-Year % Change in Employment and Wages, 2014Q1-2024Q4




Figure 2.2: Over-the-Year Percent Change in Average Monthly Employment (Number of Jobs Worked) and Total Wages in Wyoming, 2014Q1-2024Q4




Figure 2.1: Average Monthly Employment (Number of Jobs Worked) in Wyoming, 2014Q1-2024Q4




Figure 2.4: Average Monthly Employment in Mining, Including Oil & Gas (NAICS 21) in Wyoming, 2014Q1-2024Q4




Figure 2.6: Average Monthly Employment in Construction (NAICS 23) in Wyoming, 2014Q1-2024Q4




Figure 2.8: Average Monthly Employment in Professional & Business Services (NAICS 54-56) in Wyoming, 2014Q1-2024Q4




Figure 2.13: Over-the-Year Percent Change in Average Monthly Employment (Number of Jobs Worked) in Wyoming and Surrounding States, 2023-2024





Chapter 3: Population Estimates

Wyoming 2024 Population: 587,618

- From 2023 to 2024, 0.4% increase (1,898)
- Surpassed 2019 population (578,759) by 1.5% (8,859)
- From 2014 to 2024, 0.9% increase (5,087)




Figure 3.1: Estimated Resident Population of Wyoming, 2014-2024




Figure 3.1: Estimated Resident Population of Wyoming, 2014-2024




Figure 3.1: Estimated Resident Population of Wyoming, 2014-2024




Figure 3.1: Estimated Resident Population of Wyoming, 2014-2024




Figure: Percent Change in Wyoming Population, 2019-2024

Wyoming Labor Force and Unemployment Rate, 2015-2024




Figure 4.1: Wyoming Labor Force and Unemployment Rate, 2015-2024

UI Benefit Recipients in Wyoming, 1997-2024




Figure: Total Number of Unemployment Insurance Benefit Recipients in Wyoming, 1997-2024

Nonresidents in Wyoming

- Commute to work in WY for another state or country
 - Temporary, seasonal jobs
 - Often in construction and leisure & hospitality
- Moved to Wyoming but have not obtained a Wyoming driver's license


Nonresidents in Wyoming

 - Leisure & hospitality (32.6%)














Figure 7.1: Educational Attainment for Wyoming and U.S. Populations, 2023




Figure 7.2: Educational Attainment for Wyoming Population by Sex, 2023




Figure 8.1: Total Projected Job Openings in Wyoming by Educational Requirement, 2022-2032

- 18,156 STEM jobs in Wyoming
- 6.2% of all jobs
- Higher wages
- Almost all require postsecondary education




Figure 9.1: Average Hourly Wage for Software Developers (SOC 15-1252) in the U.S., Wyoming, and Surrounding States, May 2023

- 69.5% offered access to a retirement plan

Health Care Occupations, 2013-2023

- Total, all occupations: -5,160, or -1.9%
- Home health & personal care aides: +1,010, or 45.4%
- Medical & health services managers: +320, or 46.4%
- Nurse practitioners: +250, or 113.6%

Occupational Fatalities


- 45 in 2023, up from 34 in 2022


- Number of workplace injuries: 2,600
